Reporting on Responsible Climate Lobbying



Thai Oil Public Company Limited or Thaioil is involved in monitoring and evaluating that our support to trade associations do not contradict with our climate strategies and are consistent with the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) of Thailand and the Paris Agreement.

Thaioil will leverage our network in both the public and private sectors to engage in public activities, and memberships in trade associations to advocate for the development of public policies and regulations related to climate issues, in support of achieving Net Zero GHG Emissions.
